
Help each student to experience a meaningful sense of belonging. Create the environment to behold God personally and intimately. Empower students to **become** disciplemakers of Jesus.

# Structured for Success

- Bottom-up support rather than top-down power ensures volunteer leaders can be successful
- A university financial investment for 27 student leader positions within LifeGroups (with plans to grow).
- Each LifeGroup Coach meets with four volunteer LifeGroup leaders each week to model, guide, envision, and equip each individual.
- We believe: The more a leader is invested in, the more they are able to lead a spirituallytransformative small group.





### What Works

Offering six different kinds of LifeGroups: (Activity, Book-based, Bible study, Discipleship, Support, Topical)

Mentoring & equipping LifeGroup leaders with resources

Helping LifeGroup leaders set a vision for spiritually-transformative groups

Affirming leaders in personalizing their LifeGroup

Encouraging leaders to host their LifeGroup on a variety of days and times

Less is not more! We'd rather have:

- More LifeGroups with fewer people
- More content than a leader needs
- More support for leaders
- More variety & diversity to accurately reflect the diversity of campus

Connecting leaders with church members or faculty/staff who are interested in hosting a LifeGroup at their home

### What Works Well

Three primary areas we focus on:

#### **Training Our Coaches Well**

We hire tough, train well, create community, and provide ongoing leadership development to coaches.

As coaches are poured into, they are equipped to make a meaningful investment in their mentees.






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
#### Number of LifeGroups Aug-Dec 2023
