Throughout the course of this semester, I have gotten the opportunity to dive deeper into topics that previously I did not necessarily have much information or knowledge about. These topics included exploring the connections between faith and learning, science, different worldviews and cultures, epistemology, hermeneutics and more. In addition to learning about different topics, I also was able to connect my new knowledge about these topics to my social work practice as it currently is as well as looking forward into the future. The two biggest topics that I previously did not have knowledge about were Epistemology and Hermeneutics. My understanding of Epistemology is that it is the study of why we have the worldviews that we have based on the knowledge we have, how we obtained that knowledge, and if there seem to be any true or false qualities to the knowledge. Hermeneutics on the other hand is the study of Biblical interpretation. Knowing what I believe and why is extremely important for me as a social worker. There are countless worldviews out there such as a Christian worldview or scientific worldview. With each worldview come multiple strong opinions on a variety of different topics. As a social worker, I will have many people share their opinions with me. Understanding Epistemology can make me more competent as a social worker and can better allow me to acknowledge the importance of what a person believes, why they have those beliefs, and how that impacts the situation that they are experiencing currently. I subscribe to a Christian worldview, and there are going to be times where what I believe does not match up with what my client believes. This could be in a case of controversial topics such as vaccinations, abortions, and other similar controversial topics. Many of the social work values involve serving others, fighting for justice, forming relationships, and encouraging others while maintaining integrity, respect, and demonstrating competence.
