Student Support Team:

All students deserve to learn in an environment where they feel connected, safe, and encouraged to thrive. The student support team will create and integrate sustainable, high-quality social, emotional, and academic development processes and help increase students' opportunities for deeper connections to their peers, educators, and school community.

College & Career Advisor: College and Career Advisors' primary focus, working alongside School Counselors, is to create and support postsecondary success plans for every senior, increase postsecondary training and matriculation and persistence.

School Counselor: School Counselors design and deliver a comprehensive school counseling program that helps all students meet standards in the areas of academic achievement, social and emotional development, and college and career.

School Social Worker: School Social Workers serve as mental health and trauma-informed professionals who connect home, school, and community by providing direct and indirect services to students, families, and school personnel to enhance students' academic success and overall well-being.

Student Support Coach: Student Support Coaches utilize a relationship-based approach to support and assist students, staff, and families to execute comprehensive positive behavior strategies leading to the development and application of healthy student behavior.

Student Success Planning Team: Student Success Planning (SSP) teams align a personalized, relationship-based approach to connecting a broad range of supports in and out of school to engage students' strengths and meet individual needs of the whole child, enabling each and every student to thrive.
