

02/26/2020: 2.2 & 9.3: Each month, my instructor and I are required to see each child on our case load. The purpose of doing so is to check in on how things are overall, including monitoring any previously implemented interventions. On Wednesday of this week, my instructor and I conducted follow-up interviews on a very complex case involving four siblings. We had been informed that a physical altercation took place between two of the siblings at the family home, resulting in the arrest of both children. We saw each sibling at their respective schools and listened intently as each child explained what happened, engaging each child as an expert of their own experience and taking into account each perspective shared. We asked each child if they followed through on the previous interventions agreed upon, which included following a medication schedule with school personnel and maintaining consistent communication with their caretaker. We also spoke with school personnel to check in on their progress. This experience reminded me of the importance of continually monitoring intervention progress and how doing so correlates with successful goal attainment outcomes.
