Eviction Prevention Project: Social Work Processes Steps for Addressing Ethical Issues and Dilemmas

- **E** Evaluate relevant personal, societal, agency, client, and professional values
- -Determine if there is an ethical issue and/or dilemma and which area of practice it concerns. Is it a conflict of values, rights, or professional responsibilities?
- T Think about what ethical standard of the NASW Code of Ethics applies, as well as relevant laws and case decisions
 - -Identify the key values and principles of the social work profession involved.
 - **H** Hypothesize about possible consequences of different decisions
 - Utilize the guiding principle of person-in-environment and the core value of competency to determine potential outcomes and consequences
- I Identify who will benefit and who will be harmed in view of social work's commitment to the most vulnerable.
- -Consider the commitment to the welfare of the client and the individual client's presenting needs and concerns to justify prioritizing one competing value/principle over another.
 - **C** Consult with supervisor and colleagues about the most ethical choice.
 - Develop an action plan that is consistent with the ethical priorities that have been determined as central to the dilemma. Document and reflect on the outcome.
