

1.1, 1.3, 1.4: On Monday, I completed tasks asked of me by working with the Director of the City of Refuge. We worked on organizing Grants and Case Management Client files. When organizing the files, I maintained ethical and professional behavior. All of the information is confidential and will be kept confidential. This is an important concept learned in class. It was a learning experience as the case management files held all of the client's information including the following: checking and saving bank information, social security information, housing, and payment information, medical information and etc.

1.3, 1.4, 2.1, 3.1, 3.2, 4.2, For this week's youth group, we focused on wellness and how it has been affected due to COVID-19. This was an opportunity to open discussion for the youth. Many of the youth discussed their social, emotional, and financial issues that stemmed from the pandemic. This was an opportunity to show empathy for the youth and let them know they are not alone, as learned in class. After the discussion, the youth were allowed to have free time and make connections with one another by playing dodgeball, reading, playing soccer, etc. This task also allowed me to identify developmental stages in the youth. Because the group ranges from 6 grade to high school, each participant is in a different stage.

1.3, 1.4, 2.1: This week, I observed a meeting between my supervisors and the Director of Operation. The meeting focused on a logo for Uphill Coffee and Natural Goods. This is a program that will begin in the City of Refuge to advocate for wellness and health equity. I was unaware of how important a logo was, however, it will be something customers will remember. Once the program is implemented, youth from the City Lights youth group will be able to learn vocational skills by running the shop or drink cart at local schools/offices. Many other programs will be associated with Uphill Cofee.

1.1, 1.2, 1.3, 1.4, 2.1, 2.2, 3.1: This week, I was able to identify cultural differences between the Hispanic culture and the American culture. While speaking to a colleague, who is Hispanic, I asked her what she was dressing her son up for Halloween. I was not mindful that everyone does not celebrate Halloween due to cultural differences. She informed me that her family would not be dressing up as they do not celebrate. Later in the week, I was able to use this information and be mindful of cultural differences with the youth group. Instead of assuming the youth in the youth group celebrated Halloween, I asked them instead. I instantly felt that the youth were able to open up about their culture and ways in which they celebrate or not. I let the youth know I accepted their differences and treated them with respect. This really helped me connect

Hello Erin,

I see that you have access to some great learning experiences. One of the things that I'd like to you continue is sharing the skills and/or theoretical knowledge that you've learned and how it connects with your learning experience.

Points were deducted:

- 1. Each week, you should address four different competencies.
- 2. If you choose a practice behavior, be sure to be clear in how they connect. For instance, in Week 1, 1.3 does not share how this activity allowed you to reflect. I am having trouble making the connections.
- 3. Journals are to be submitted by students by the first Sunday of each month.

Note: Though there are some experiences that might touch on multiple practice behaviors, don't forget to make the clear connection. If you choose 5 PBs for a section discuss on all of them
