My Theoretical Practice Framework serves as a compass to guide me through the daily activities and complex client situations I will engage in during my field experience. There are four areas that I pulled from to develop this framework. The first of these is my social work training and education. The NASW code of Ethics and Values are the lens through which I view clients and their circumstances and the foundation for how I conduct myself. Additionally, principles such as seeking supervision and using evidence-based interventions are included in this framework. Federal and State laws and regulations provides the legal standards for me and the agency and are important to know and follow. Adoration Hospice's mission and values are an essential part of this framework as they outline my purpose and role as a social worker in this setting. The company's policies and procedures guide daily activities and conduct. Lastly, theory helps me to understand clients, especially in complex situations. I specifically selected systems theory, person in environment, and family resilience theory as I felt they applied well to hospice social work.
