Strength

- Partnerships with Local Women's Clinics
- A strong leader at partnership for Families, Children and Adults
- Access to phones, printers, and fax machines
- Partnership with Galen Medical Group , made up of 29 physicians
- 10 Licensed therapists with proper training
- Strong CBT program Curriculum
- -Presence at local health fairs, schools, and businesses
- -Holistic approach, proving therapy and case management Dedicated Staff
- -Unique to other programs in the area
- Program provides community education

Weakness

- Only one location with limited spots available for clients
- This is a new program so more time is needed to build rapport with the community.
- It is difficult to access low-income mothers that might not seek medical assistance
- Additional funding is needed and there are limited resources available
- LCSWs are able to independently do counseling in the community for money income without case management.
 Finding more to employ may be challenging.

Opportunity

- There are high rates of PPD in Tennessee, which means there is an opportunity for more services in this area
- There is some grant funding available to help sponsor mothers with PPD from Postpartum Support international
- Community outreach can provide physicians in the community with an increased willingness to learn about PPD and refer women for services.

Threat

- Physicians may opt for patients to be prescribed medication and not referred to Bright Beginnings
- Lack of Mental Health knowledge in the Community
- Guilt mothers feel surrounding PPD may limit their willingness to seek help
- Low-income and women of color mothers may not be insured, leading to them not seeking assistance
- Limited maternity leave could impact a mother's ability to attend sessions
- This program is reliant on grant funding and donations to run. Funding insecurity is a threat
