## PTSD Curriculum (Updated 07/25/12)

Define – This curriculum is to educate professionals of PTSD and the effects on the patient, family and social environment. Throughout the process students and professionals will learn to define, assess and treat PTSD and TBI.

Knowledge – Students to aquire knowledge of PTSD, Military culture, Family roles, and intergration back in to "civilian life"

Value – To provide knowledge to professional social workers to work with Veterans, families, and PTSD to assist military men and women returning from war

Skills – a basic knowledge of skills to work with the veterans and families to process the effects of PTSD and adaptive skills.

#### DESCRIPTION

Theoretical and practical approaches to clinical practice with military families. Overview of common social issues in the military system and demands on the family dynamic upon return and PTSD diagnosis.

#### **COURSE DESCRIPTION**

The purpose of this course is to understand the military culture within which military families function, the stressors such as deployment that they navigate, and the diversity of military family structures and how a range of diversity filters can impact the military family and military culture. The different military contexts (i.e., active duty, guard/reserve, veteran) are explored. Ethical issues for working in this environment are considered. Theory-based and research-informed strategies to intervene with military families are reviewed. Military family policies are examined and critiqued. Students completing this course will have a more in-depth understanding of and ability to work with the military and the military families that are a vital part of society.

### **COURSE OBJECTIVES**

The Practice and application of theory with the Military Family and PTSD: Objective # Objectives

1 Provide students with an understanding of the military culture and how military families cope with and thrive within the military.

2 Challenge the student to consider ethical dilemmas, diversity issues, and the many

stressors inherent in the military, when striving to intervene with military families.

3 Explore theories and research-informed intervention strategies and have the student

assess and develop intervention goals with case studies.

Achievement of meeting above goals will be measured by test and scenarios evaluations in the intensive face-to-face classes.

# **COURSE FORMAT / INSTRUCTIONAL METHODS**

The instructional methods used in this class will be classroom discussion, student presentations on key

topics, in-class critical thinking exercises, use of videotapes and a case-based final exam. This class will also be web-enhanced using Eclass.
