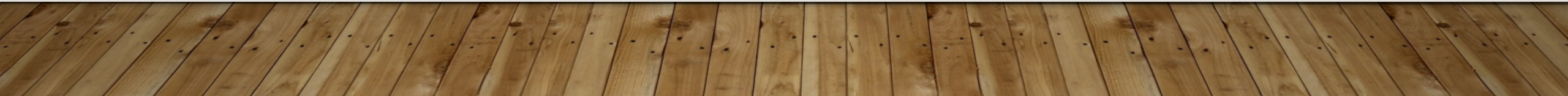

---

- **What is the definition of human trafficking?**  
"The United Nations defines human trafficking as the recruitment, transportation, transfer, harboring, or receipt of persons by improper means (such as force, abduction, fraud, or coercion) for an improper purpose including forced labor or sexual exploitation." It takes on many forms today and they are listed below.
- Domestic Servitude, Sex Trafficking, Forced Labor, Bonded Labor, Child Labor, Forced Marriage.

# FACTS

---

- **Myth: Only women and girls can be victims and survivors of sex trafficking**
- **Reality:** One study estimates that as many as half of sex trafficking victims and survivors are male. Advocates believe that percentage may be even higher but that male victims are far less likely to be identified. LGBTQ boys and young men are seen as particularly vulnerable to trafficking. *ECPAT USA AND BOYS TOO study.*
- **Myth: It's always or usually a violent crime**
- **Reality:** By far the most pervasive myth about human trafficking is that it always - or often - involves kidnapping or otherwise physically forcing someone into a situation. In reality, most human traffickers use psychological means such as, tricking, defrauding, manipulating or threatening victims into providing commercial sex or exploitative labor.

## THE SOLUTION

---

- Developing a Fundraising committee as a part of the Board of Directors
  - oversees all fundraising efforts and develops new ideas and contacts
  - Utilizing community charitable organizations such as United Way and religious organizations
  - Utilizing Federal, State, and private grants and scholarships
  - Developing annual Fundraisers in the community
- Develop an engagement committee as part of the Board of Directors
  - Finding and developing relationships with new volunteers
  - Training volunteers
  - Ensuring volunteers feel appreciated and engaged to keep them involved
- Continue to assess and evaluate the effectiveness of the programs work. Direct feedback from the clients will inform us.
