## Senior Spotlight: Cristy Kay

On Sunday, January 15, the Jewish Federation of Greater Chattanooga hosted a communitywide service project. This year over 100 volunteers from the Jewish community as well as Southern Adventist University took part in six projects that all benefitted Barger Academy of Fine Arts, a local elementary school in the Brainerd area.

By the end of the day, two learning mats were made for math and spelling games, a brick walkway was laid making it easier for the kids and staff to travel to and from

outdoor classrooms, materials for 80 puppets were cut for a drama class, many birthday cards and crowns were made, 52 book readings were recorded for first and second grade students, and a truck full of school supplies were collected. As part of Cristy Kay's senior year field placement, she was responsible for coordinating this event. Cristy worked with the Jewish Federation Director of Programs, Ann Treadwell and Director of Social Services, Amy Boulware to coordinate all of the details

associated with the six projects. She met with team leaders for each project, arranged for supplies and handled the logistics of the day itself. Cristy was able to learn how to a project goes from an idea to reality with all the bumps and stress that goes along with it. Cristy is an outstanding example of a student who takes her field placement seriously and is willing to literally get her hands dirty to get the job done!

### Groundbreaking Domestic Violence Workshop contributed by Lisa Koffler

In February, the School of Social Work held a seminar on domestic violence. The first of several, this seminar was geared specifically toward training pastors to be first responders in the area of domestic violence. This ground-breaking workshop was held on Southern's campus with pastors from the Georgia-Cumberland Conference in attendance. As the first known worldwide attempt to train and educate pastors to be first responders in the problem of domestic violence,

this was a truly revolutionary event.

During the training, pastors learned of Dr. Drumm's research and how prevalent domestic violence is within Adventist congregations. They listened as a former victim shared her experience of abuse by her husband, who was a well-known church member. At the end of training, the pastors engaged in role-play to practice responding to victims' reports.

Dr. Drumm has engaged in extensive research on domestic violence

in the Seventh-day Adventist Church since the 1980's. Research findings suggest that pastors are people that victims confide in but often they are not as helpful as the victims of domestic violence would like them to be. From this research, Dr. Drumm has found what is most helpful for victims of domestic violence in the church. She is working towards sharing this information with pastors so they may better meet the needs of their congregations.
